

## Introduction and Description of Services

The Agency submits this Title VI/Nondiscrimination Plan in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 49 CFR Part 21, 23 CFR 200 and FTA Circular 4702.1B. 






**Median Household Income Map** 




**Percent Below Poverty Level** 




**Households with Resident Over 65**




#### **Public Participation Plan**
